The purpose of this letter is to keep you informed about your remaining unemployment benefits under the Unemployment Insurance (UI) program. As of February 2, 2010, you have \$355.00 remaining. Once this amount has been exhausted, additional unemployment benefits will not be available. This is because, according to federal law, Wisconsin's unemployment rate is currently below the threshold for paying such benefits.

If you become eligible for additional federal UI benefits in the future, we will automatically notify you. We are committed to ensuring that you receive all of the benefits for which you are eligible.

We understand that the ending of these benefits under such tough economic times can present a significant hardship. We have compiled a list of resources that you may find helpful and encourage you to contact these resources, if needed.

- Online job search assistance is available at www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com where you can post your resume and search for new job opportunities. The website currently has over 17,000 job openings listed.
- You can check your eligibility for other State-funded support programs and apply for some of these programs at www.access.wisconsin.gov. For information on local support services call 211, which is a centralized phone number for social support services.
- The Wisconsin Department of Health Services provides many programs that assist families and individuals with food and provide health care coverage, such as BadgerCare Plus, FoodShare, and Women Infants and Children (WIC).
